Richard Kitchen ist Privatdozent der Geschichte im Fachbereich der Sozialwissenschaften im New Mexico Military Institute in Roswell, New Mexico und zurzeit Gastprofessor der Fulbright-Kommission an der Universität Trier. Er promovierte in Geschichte an der Arizona State University in Tempe. Seine Recherche- und Lehrinteressen gelten der kulturellen Interaktion, den amerikanischen Ureinwohnern, dem amerikanischen Westen des 19. Jahrhunderts und der „Public Memory“. Er verfügt über Lehrerfahrung auf unterschiedlichen Lernniveaus. Richard Kitchen stand 2005/2006 auf der nationalen Ehrenliste der herausragenden Lehrenden im „Who is who in America“ (2008 und 2009) und er hatte 2004-2005 die John K. Funk Professur des New Mexico Military Institute inne.

Richard Kitchen is an Associate Professor of History in the Department of Social Sciences at New Mexico Military Institute, Roswell, New Mexico. Currently, he is a Visiting Fulbright Professor at the University of Trier, Germany. He received his Doctor of Philosophy in History from Arizona State University, Tempe. His areas of research and teaching interests include Cultural Interaction, Native Americans, 19th Century American West, and Public Memory. He has taught a variety of classes at all educational levels. He has been listed as a National Honor Roll Outstanding American Teachers (2005/2006), Who's Who in America (2008 and 2009 editions), and received the John K. Funk Professorship from New Mexico Military Institute (2004-2005).
